

Research Higher Degree Student Grants

AIMS:

The DSI RHD Student Grants mechanism primarily supports the DSI mission of *assisting and enhancing defence-relevant research engagement between universities, industry, DST Group and Defence organisations* while supporting capability development.

Specifically, the Grants aim to:

- ▶ develop research linkages between universities and DST Group and Defence sector businesses;
- ▶ support capacity building in research areas where Defence has an interest;
- ▶ promote new Defence-related research linkages between universities.

by providing stipend support for students undertaking their RHD on Defence-related projects and/or undertaking Defence-industry placements as part of their study.

NATURE OF THE GRANT:

The grant is to provide partial stipend support for RHD students working on collaborative, Defence-relevant projects.

The grant shall be awarded to the primary supervisor of the student for payment by the enrolling institution as living stipend:

- ▶ \$15,000 payable in two instalments
 1. \$5,000 on enrolment or execution of the grant agreement, whichever is the latter
 2. \$10,000 on confirmation

Grants will be awarded for proposed RHD projects where a student has not yet been identified as well as those where a student is enrolled, subject to the conditions below.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ▶ DSI RHD Support Grants are open to academic staff of DSI Participant universities in Victoria and Tasmania. University Liaison Managers for each DSI Participant university can be viewed [here](#).
- ▶ The research project must be Defence-relevant.
- ▶ Projects can be undertaken within any discipline provided it can demonstrate alignment to Defence interests. Multi-disciplinary projects are encouraged.
- ▶ For security purposes, the student must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident.
- ▶ It is desirable for the student to have at least one co-supervisor (formal or informal as part of a collaboration) at either an industry partner, the DST Group or another university.
- ▶ The project must be substantially based, and the student enrolled in a Victorian or Tasmania University.
- ▶ Employees of DST Group are **NOT** eligible for support as students on these projects.
- ▶ Where the grant will support a student, who has already commenced on the project, it is preferred that they be within 3 months of commencement at the time of application.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

Applications for funding will be assessed by the DSI Research Leaders Forum against the following selection criteria:

- ▶ Defence relevance of RHD project
- ▶ Nature/Strength of collaboration, including opportunities for the student to undertake an industry/DST Group internship as part of their study
- ▶ Home organisation of the co-supervisor/s – preference will be given for co-supervisors in industry or DST Group. Where supervisors are at different universities, preference will be given to new collaborations.

CONDITIONS OF AWARD:

- ▶ Unless already enrolled, the student must commence within six (6) months of the execution of the grant agreement. In the event that a suitable student has not been identified and enrolled within this period, the grant will be rescinded.
- ▶ Payment of the first instalment of the grant is conditional upon enrolment of the student.
- ▶ Payment of the second instalment of the grant is conditional upon successful confirmation.
- ▶ The student must conform to the usual requirements of the enrolling university in regard to eligibility, satisfactory progress, research integrity, ethics and other related matters.
- ▶ During the course of their enrolment, the student must attend a DMTC Annual Student Conference if one is run.
- ▶ The supervisor must provide annual reports regarding the student's progress on the project
- ▶ Copies of any research publications arising from the project must be provided to DSI (excluding the thesis) and DSI support must be acknowledged within the publication.
- ▶ An appropriate form of acknowledgement is "This research was supported by the Defence Science Institute, an initiative of the State Government of Victoria or Tasmania" or similar.
- ▶ On submission of the thesis a short lay abstract, suitable for website or newsletter publishing must be supplied to DSI.

APPLYING FOR THE AWARD:

- ▶ Applications will be accepted at any time throughout 2023. However, as funds for this year are limited, applicants are encouraged to submit early.
- ▶ Applications are to be submitted by the primary supervisor and must be endorsed by the external co-supervisor/s.
